# QRD1113, QRD1114 Reflective Object Sensor


## **Features**

- Phototransistor Output
- No contact surface sensing
- Unfocused for sensing diffused surfaces
- Compact Package
- Daylight filter on sensor

## **Description**

The QRD1113/14 reflective sensor consists of an infrared emitting diode and an NPN silicon phototransistor mounted side by side in a black plastic housing. The onaxis radiation of the emitter and the on-axis response of the detector are both perpendicular to the face of the QRD1113/14. The phototransistor responds to radiation emitted from the diode only when a reflective object or surface is in the field of view of the detector.


# **Package Dimensions**

- 1. Dimensions for all drawings are in inches (millimeters).
- 2. Tolerance of ± .010 (.25) on all non-nominal dimensions unless otherwise specified.
- 3. Pins 2 and 4 typically .050" shorter than pins 1 and 3.
- 4. Dimensions controlled at housing surface.

## Absolute Maximum Ratings (T<sub>A</sub> = 25°C unless otherwise specified)

#### Notes:

- 1. Derate power dissipation linearly 1.33mW/°C above 25°C.
- 2. RMA flux is recommended.
- 3. Methanol or isopropyl alcohols are recommended as cleaning agents.
- 4. Soldering iron tip 1/16" (1.6 mm) minimum from housing.
- 5. As long as leads are not under any stress or spring tension.
- 6. D is the distance from the sensor face to the reflective surface.
- 7. Crosstalk (I<sub>CK</sub>) is the collector current measured with the indicated current on the input diode and with no reflective surface.
- 8. Measured using Eastman Kodak neutral white test card with 90% diffused reflecting as a reflecting surface.

Fig. 1 Forward Voltage vs. Forward Current




Fig. 2 Normalized Collector Current vs.
Forward Current




Fig. 3 Normalized Collector Current vs. Temperature






Fig. 4 Normalized Collector Dark Current vs.
